I shook my head. "What do you mean by *bad pictures*?"

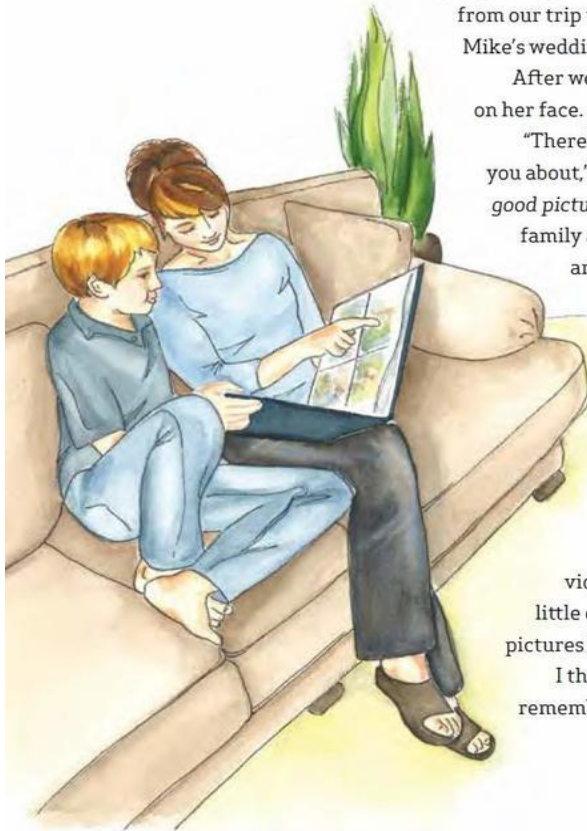
Mom closed the photo album and looked at me. "The bad pictures I'm talking about are called **pornography** or **porn**."

"What's poor-nog-gra-fee?"

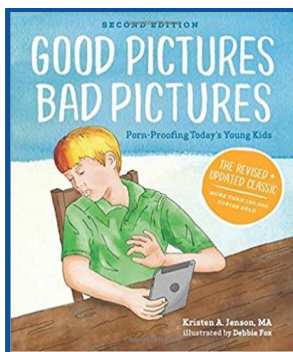
I asked.
