

Maryland General Assembly dealing now with Sexting by Minors and Child Porn Possession

The problem of minors using their cell phones to transmit sexually explicit images of others or themselves blew up last year in Maryland when a teen girl was convicted on child porn charges (as reported in our <u>last newsletter</u>). As predicted, bills have been introduced in both houses of the General Assembly attempting to address this difficult and disturbing problem, a fast-growing trend among teens. MCAP is following all of these and expects to present testimony at soon-upcoming hearings.


We applaud the efforts of the sponsors of these bills (see below). The most in-depth bill, 21 pages long, is Senator Susan Lee's <u>SB 365</u>, and is cross-filed in the house, HB 501. It aims to balance the need to prevent creation and distribution of child pornography, protect minors from being coerced into sending images of themselves, and prevent minors from being *criminally* prosecuted for what has become a far-too-common practice.



PORN – IT STILL NEEDS TO BE RECOGNIZED AS A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS

MCAP will try yet *again* to urge passage of a resolution, **HJ 2** in our Maryland General Assembly, to declare pornography to be a public health crisis. Fifteen states in the U.S. have passed such resolutions over the last 4 years, hopefully paving the way to further research and education about this very important plague that is damaging so many families, individuals, relationships, livelihoods, and especially, our youth. It feeds into human trafficking and, in the hands of predators, it is used as the *worst kind of sex education*, often to groom innocent children and the mentally challenged. The explosion of sexting referenced above is another related, sad symptom, as is the growing problem of child-on-child sexually problematic behavior and assault, e.g by older siblings on younger ones, and baby-sitter treatment of the children they are supposed to be caring for. To give credit where credit is due, there was Maryland legislation passed in 2019 intended to curtail child erotica, for which sponsors are to be thanked. See a good article about the rationale for that here. Thanks go out to Montgomery County Del. Lesley Lopez and Sen. Susan Lee, as well as Del. C.T. Wilson (Charles County) and Del. Jesse Pippy (Frederick County), who also worked on updating the language in Maryland's child pornography laws to include lascivious acts and computer-generated images.

For families concerned about the dangers involved with teens misusing smart phones, there is a new type of cell phone to consider with just the essentials - phone, texting, calendar, alarm and calculator: <u>Gabb Wireless phone</u> can limit access to the excesses of technology, too soon for many youth. No Internet, games, social media, no app store, no picture messages. no group texting.

<u>Protect Young Minds</u> - This organization's web site has an abundance of resources and advice to build the resilience of children to porn, advise families to deal with online dangers before and after exposure, and train activists on ways to advocate. Videos, books, PDF's, a blog, checklists, and more. Here's a timely example, given the family-unfriendly nature of the Super Bowl half-time show that featured skimpy attire and sexually-themed performance (even pole dancing): Booty Shaking & Sexy Costumes in Children's Dance: How to Find Healthy Studios That Won't Objectify Your Kid.
